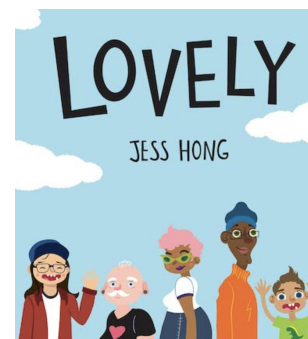
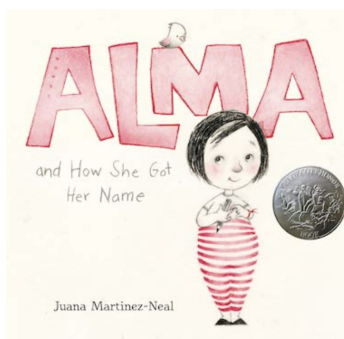
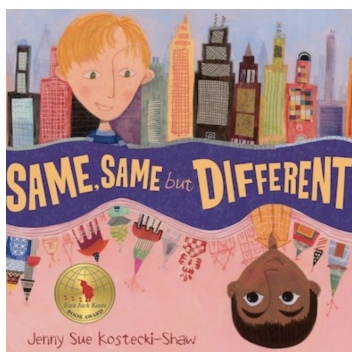

Books & Tips for Talking With Children About Race

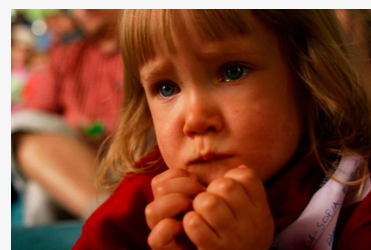
1. Take every opportunity that comes up to communicate with your child.
